

INVITATION FOR NOMINATIONS TO SERVE AS CHAIRPERSON OF THE KOEBERG PUBLIC SAFETY INFORMATION FORUM.

The National Nuclear Regulator (NNR) is an independent regulatory authority established as a juristic person in terms of section 3 of the National Nuclear Regulator Act (Act No. 47 of 1999) to regulate the safe use of nuclear and radioactive materials in order to protect persons, property and the environment from the potential harmful effects of nuclear radiation in South Africa.

In terms of the National Nuclear Regulator Act, the NNR's regulatory mandate involves the following priority areas;

- (a) Provide for the protection of persons, property and the environment against nuclear damage through the establishment of safety standards and regulatory practices;
- (b) Exercise regulatory control related to safety over:
 - (i) the siting, design, construction, operation, manufacture of component parts, and decontamination, decommissioning and closure of nuclear installations; and
 - (ii) vessels propelled by nuclear power or having radioactive material on board which is capable of causing nuclear damage, through the granting of nuclear authorisations;
- (c) exercise regulatory control over other actions, to which this Act applies, through the granting of nuclear authorisations;
- (d) provide assurance of compliance with the conditions of nuclear authorisations through the implementation of a system of compliance inspections;
- (e) fulfil national obligations in respect of international legal instruments concerning nuclear safety; and
- (f) ensure that provisions for nuclear emergency planning are in place.

In accordance with licence condition 28 of the Koeberg NIL - 01 and the provisions of Section 26(4) of the National Nuclear Regulator Act, the authorisation holder Eskom is responsible for the establishment of a Public Safety Information Forum (PSIF) to inform the persons living in the municipal area in respect of which an emergency plan has been established on nuclear and radiation safety information related to the Koeberg nuclear power station.

A further provision in accordance with Regulation R968 of 12 September 2008, is for the PSIF to have a Chairperson and Deputy Chairperson who shall be appointed by the NNR Board of Directors, from nominations received from members of the public living in the relevant municipal area. The Chairperson and Deputy Chairperson will serve for a period of two years and perform their duties without financial compensation. The current term for the Chairperson of the Koeberg Public Safety Information Forum expires in **January 2024**.

Members of the public are hereby invited to submit nominations for the Chairperson of the Koeberg Public Safety Information Forum.

Please take note of the following requirements for submitting nominations:

- Only written nominations will be considered. (Hand written or typed)
- A declaration of acceptance by the nominee must accompany the written nomination.
- A copy of the nominee's current CV.
- Certified copies of identity documents for the nominee and the person making the nomination.

The selection criteria includes but not limited to the following:

- Submission must comply with the requirements as advertised;
- Nominee must reside in the relevant municipal area as per regulation;
- Experience in community based initiatives; and
- Attendance of Public Safety Information Forum meetings.

UITNODIGING VIR NOMINASIES OM AS VOORSITTER VAN DIE KOEBERG OPENBARE VEILIGHEIDSLIGTINGSFORUM (OVIF) TE DIEN

Die Nasionale Kernreguleerder (NKR) is 'n onafhanklike reguleringsowerheid wat ingevolge artikel 3 van die Wet op die Nasionale Kernreguleerder (Wet No. 47 van 1999) as 'n regs persoon ingestel is om die veilige gebruik van kern- en radioaktiewe materiaal te reguleer ten einde persone, eiendom en die omgewing teen die moontlike skadelike effekte van bestraling in Suid-Afrika te beskerm.

Ingevolge die Wet op die Nasionale Kernreguleerder behels die NKR se regulatoriese mandaat die volgende prioriteitsareas:

- (a) die daarstelling van veiligheidstandaarde en regulerende praktyke om voorsiening te maak vir die beskerming van persone, eiendom en die omgewing teen kernskade;
- (b) regulerende beheer in verband met die veiligheid van:(i) die aanlê, ontwerp, oprigting, bedryf, vervaardiging van onderdele, en die ontsmetting, buitediensstelling en sluiting van kerninstallasies; en
(ii) kernaangedrewe vaartuie of vaartuie wat radioaktiewe materiaal aan boord het wat kernskade kan veroorsaak deur die toestaan van kernmagtigings uit te oefen.
- (c) regulerende beheer oor ander handelingte waarop hierdie Wet van toepassing is deur die toestaan van kernmagtigings uit te oefen;
- (d) deur die implementering van 'n stelsel van inspeksies te verseker sodat die voorwaardes van kernmagtigings nagekom word;
- (e) nasionale verpligtinge ten opsigte van internasionale regsinstrumente rakende kernveiligheid na te kom; en
- (f) toe te sien dat voorskrifte vir kernnoodbeplanning daargestel is.

Ingevolge Lisensievoorwaarde 28 van die Koeberg NIL - 01 en die bepalings van artikel 26(4) van die Wet op die Nasionale Kernreguleerder, is die houer van die kernmagtiging, Eskom, verantwoordelik vir die instelling van 'n openbare veiligheidsinligtingsforum (OVIF) om die persone woonagtig in die munisipale gebied ten opsigte waarvan 'n noodplan ingestel is, te voorsien van inligting rakende bestraling- en kernveiligheid ten opsigte van die Koeberg kernkragentrale.

'n Verdere bepaling ingevolge Regulasie R968 van 12 September 2008 is dat die OVIF 'n Voorsitter en Ondervoorsitter moet hê wat aangestel is deur die NKR-direksie uit nominasies wat ontvang is van lede van die publiek woonagtig in die betrokke munisipale gebied. Die Voorsitter en Ondervoorsitter sal vir 'n termyn van twee jaar dien en hulle pligte sonder finansiële vergoeding uitvoer. Die huidige termyn van die Voorsitter van die Koeberg Openbare Veiligheidsinligtingsforum verstryk op 31 Julie 2023.

Lede van die publiek word hiermee uitgenooi om nominasies in te dien vir die Voorsitter van die Koeberg Openbare Veiligheidsinligtingsforum.

Geliewe kennis te neem van die volgende vereistes vir nominasies wat ingedien word:

- Slegs skriftelike nominasies sal oorweeg word (handgeskrewe of getik);
- 'n Verklaring van aanvaarding deur die genomineerde moet die skriftelike nominasie vergesels;
- 'n Afskrif van die genomineerde se huidige CV;
- Gewaarmerkte afskrifte van identiteitsdokumente van die genomineerde en die persoon wat die nominasie indien; en
